### **ACHIEVEMENT PROGRAM**

Master Builder – Prototype Models

(eighth in a series)

This month we will talk about the requirements for *Master Builder - Prototype Models*. Like the other certificates, the full requirements for this category are available on the Internet at the NMRA site, www.nmra.org.

The *Prototype Models* certificate was a natural category for me to qualify for, but others may feel that it is the most challenging category in the entire AP program. However, I think that it accurately reflects the trend in our hobby toward more prototype models and layouts. Note that the *Prototype Models* category has a number of requirements that seem similar to the *Master Builder - Scenery* category. However, there are significant differences.

To qualify for the *Master Builder - Prototype Models* certificate, you must construct an animated or static model of a prototype scene containing at least six models of prototype equipment and structures. Of the six models, you must include at least four different models including 1) rolling stock; 2) a railroad structure; 3) a caboose or passenger car; and 4) motive power. Two of the required six models must be scratchbuilt and the remaining four models must be super-detailed. The prototype scene, with the six models in it, must be capable of winning a Merit Award, i.e., earning 87½ points.

While these requirements might seem very similar to the Master Builder - Scenery Category, the major difference that one might notice is that there is no minimum size requirement like there is for the Scenery category. Note too that the individual models do not need to be capable of winning a Merit Award. Instead, only the completed scene is judged but the entire scene must score a minimum of 87½ points. The prototype scene is judged using the following criteria:

- Terrain (35 points)
- Structures (35 points)
- Background (15 points)
- Lighting (5 points)
- Realism/Conformity (35 points)

In addition to building the models, you must submit 2 sets of photographs (or a video tape

presentation) that will document the prototype being modeled and the model itself. In other words, you need to describe in photos and text how you have duplicated the prototype scene. You also need to prepare a written description which, along with photographs and possibly maps, shows how the modeled scene replicates the actual prototype scene. Include in the written description the intended setting of the model railroad and describe the scenic details used to achieve the desired effect. If at all possible, take pictures of your model that are from the same angle as pictures that you have of the prototype. That way you can have side-by-side pictures showing how well you have recreated the scene you are modeling. If you drafted your own building plans (which you will often have to do), include them too along with a description of how you developed them. This is one category in which you cannot have too much documentation! Obviously, you need to model a scene for which you can supply prototype photos. These same photos are essential to your modeling efforts.

While the AP category might seem daunting to some, I see it instead as simply documentation of the ever-growing prototype approach to the hobby. For example, assume that you build some rolling stock, a structure or two, and a locomotive, a couple of which are scratchbuilt, all based on actual prototypes. If you enter each of them in a divisional, regional, or National modeling contest, so much the better....if they score Merit Awards, these awards can be used toward the other categories for Cars, Structures, and/or Motive Power. Then build up a module or diorama (or better yet, a portion of your layout) to duplicate a specific scene which could include these models (especially the structures!) and you might be on the road to award of this AP category. However, I must warn you (with tongue in cheek) that prototype modeling is additive! First you find a few photos of your favorite prototype, then you find that you need more information, and you soon find that you are hooked!

Once you have satisfied all of the requirements, submit a Statement of Qualifications (SOQ) which includes the required descriptions and photos.

### Contest – Started Yet? Jack Dziadul

Our March special modeling contest requires using the Life-Like HO Scale Coaling Tower kit number 1377. Build your kit using a minimum of 50% of the parts and display it on a diorama/base (maximum size of 24" by 36" in HO scale and 24" by 18" in N scale). Identify the structure(s) with a sign or an index card explaining what it is. Prizes will be awarded for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place "popular vote" and the Board of Directors will award 3 additional prizes. All prizes will be model railroading tools and/or supplies that can be used in any scale. Be sure to take notes and photograph your progress so that we can include a brief article in the April edition of "The Herald".

- <u>Model Railroading" Exhibit</u> at the California State Railroad Museum are continuing to pour in. Among the more noteworthy are:
  - The World's Greatest Hobby campaign has pledged \$50,000 toward the Exhibit.
  - Cincinnati Division 7, in the Mid-Central Region, has pledged \$15,000 toward the Exhibit.

Current pledge and donation totals are now over \$200,000, but the NMRA still needs to raise an additional \$50,000 to meet the \$250,000 "matching challenge pledge" by an anonymous donor. - Meeting will be held in Atlanta, Georgia, at the Sheraton Suites Galleria-Atlanta, on February 8-10. Although the Board meets in a closed caucus the evening of February 8, the general meeting is open to all NMRA members on February 9 and 10.
- Hasea.com, the model railroad association located in China which has aligned itself with the NMRA, has invited the NMRA President and a few other NMRA officials to tour the new, highly restricted Chinese High Speed Rail factory and facilities in February. No foreign visitors have ever had the opportunity to view these facilities

before. As you may recall from NMRA Magazine articles and blurbs here, Hasea is a network of 100,000 Chinese railfans and modelers. The NMRA Board has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding with Hasea to share our standards and organizational knowledge.

- The <u>Peachtree Express 2013 website</u> <u>has been updated</u>, and now lists all the planned prototype and general interest tours, along with all layout tours. 
- November minutes approved on motion by Jim Murphy with Vic Bitleris second.

The CPD13 group contributes to the local community in a very special way each year during the Christmas holiday season. In the Holiday Trains for Kids (HTFK) program, members seek out less-fortunate families with children that will appreciate a brand new electric train set as a holiday gift. Members seek out families through their church or community organizations, or by personal contact with families that may not be in a position to provide such a special gift to a child at Christmas. CPD13 has been participating in this activity for many years, and it's a very special feeling to hand over a new train set to a family and see the appreciation from the parents and the joy in the children's eyes.

# CONSTRUCTING AND RECONSTRUCTING THE CLSC&W RAILROAD

Welcome to the CLSC&W Railroad. After years of designing, I decided I that needed a train layout where I would be able to freelance the New York Central System. In 1999, I decided it was time. I love the upper part of New York especially the Albany area and all the mountains and small towns in valleys. My favorite time of year is fall and all the colors the trees produce. Therefore, I decided to create a fictitious town in a valley surrounded with mountains, woods and rocks using reds, oranges, greens and brownish colors to create this fall scene.

I have fond memories of the trains I used to see as a youngster growing up in New York and going to Harmon Yards with my grandfather who worked for the NYC. After purchasing every book I could get my hands on and subscribing to a number of model railroad magazines, I decided to build the railroad in HO-Scale; like I did as a child some 40 years before.

My first HO-Scale adventure was at age 6 and if I remember, it ran on the floor of my home. The following year we moved and I was given a room to put the trains on a single sheet of plywood. I knew that someday I would want a larger version. A third move gave me my own room next to my dad's home office. Still, I had just one sheet of plywood sitting on an antique table. But, I thought that I was in heaven. In 1977, it was off to the military and many moves and years separated me from my trains. One day my parents found some boxes in their

attic that were labeled "Stephen". After moving to North Carolina in 1993, I retrieved those boxes not knowing what was stored away; military uniforms, or maybe my old baseball card collection. Who knew what? The last four boxes had all my old trains and buildings from 1965 looking like they were in good shape. At this point, my dream started to come alive.

I kept designing and designing with three or four more moves until I settled down to my current location in 1999. I looked in those old boxes and I realized there was no progress other than drawings and dreams. I had become a virtual model railroader.

When I settled down at my current location there was a building outside I knew could be used for the trains. The building is 48' long by 25' wide. After many hard months, of digging out the clay, laying the floor and framing , insulating and dry walling, and getting electricity out there (no heat or air for 5 or 6 more years. Space heaters and fans had to do). My only regret was I that never took pictures of how it originally looked. I just photographed the completed stages.

I purchased the <u>HOW TO BUILD MODEL</u> <u>RAILROAD BENCH WORKBOOK</u> and immediately became absorbed. The more I studied the bench work, the more I knew that this would be a great place to start.

In 1999 the CLSC&W branch of the NYC was started with the help of my father, CPD member Charles Wood.

With the bench work completed and not really understanding everything, I built it as I did some 40 years before; free standing with a pop-up. I learned that during the thirteen years I had this layout it was very difficult to reach the tracks as well as the yard. We expanded the yard in 2004 as we thought the tracks were too short. We added 1 ½ sheets of plywood to the yard. The layout featured four main lines with passenger service on the upper level (2 tracks) with 48" and 46" radius curves and the lower two tracks were the freight lines. There were five line side industries as the focus is the yard with 15 classification sidings, a 5 stall round house, 3 engine houses and 2 of the classification sidings just for the cabooses. The entire layout was set for the fall season with plenty of mountains across the back and the lower tracks set inside a valley. The upper tracks were carved out of the mountain.

### **Clerk's Annual Report**

We began 2012 with 135 members and we ended the year with 120 members. A review of the roster suggests that most of the RailPass memberships that were subscribed for the Carolina Piedmont Convention were not converted to permanent memberships after their six-month trial ended.

The CPD census is detailed below:

- 92 Regular memberships
- 13 Life members
- 6 Family members
- 9 RailPass members

NMRA is preparing to distribute a periodic email directly to members. This new communication tool is expected to begin within the next 2-3 months. In preparation for this undertaking and to ensure that the CPD members are receiving full value for their dues, the Clerk contacted every member in 2012 to ensure that we had the correct contact information in the NMRA member database. This effort resulted in a number of address, email and / or telephone corrections or updates. It also Group resulted in additional Yahoo memberships.

The Clerk is responsible for recording the minutes of CPD meetings. These have been published in subsequent issues of "The Herald". **Rob Rousseau** took minutes on occasions when the Clerk was not able to attend a meeting.

Among the Clerk's duties is assigning an Editor for The Herald. I have continued as the Editor and we produced twelve monthly issues in 2012.
