# Proposed By-Law Changes

Jerry Mersch and Jack Dziadul reviewed the By-Laws to determine if any need revision. The following items were reviewed with the Board of Directors and the general membership in attendance at the November meeting.

1.2 Status. Paragraph 3, 1st sentence.

No part of the net earnings of the Division shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, board members or other private persons, except that the Division shall be authorized and empowered to compensation for reasonable services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth hereafter, including nominal cash or prize awards related to contest participation.

The above change is recommended to recognize that there may be nominal prizes awarded to membership for recognition of popular vote contest results, contest participation, Superintendent's Member of the Year award or other such nominal prizes as determined by the Board of Directors. This change is also in keeping with the spirit of Section 1.4 Purpose, which in part reads "4. To sponsor model railroad conventions, meets, clinics, and contests."

# Save the Date for Spencer



# The Wiscasset, Waterville and Farmington Railway

Planning for a vacation in New England? Better yet in Maine. Looking for a great time! I had a great time riding an actual 2.0 foot Narrow Gauge railway and getting the grand tour of their facilities.

The Wiscasset, Waterville and Farmington Railway (WW&F) operated as a for profit company from 1895 until 1933. It operated from Wiscasset, Maine to Albion and Winslow, Maine. The line became defunct and was abandoned in 1936.

The Wiscasset, Waterville and Farmington Railway Museum, Inc. was formed in the early 1990s as a non-profit organization to restore several privately owned pieces of former WW&F rolling stock. Approximately 2 miles of former WW&F track in Alna was rebuilt and is currently operated as a heritage railroad using two foot gauge steam and diesel locomotives and other historic equipment.

The WW&F Railway complex is located 4.7 miles northeast of Wiscasset, Maine. The museum is open on Saturday and if there is enough workers on hand, you may be able to tour the engine barn and view all the projects being worked on.

If you can go on Sunday, you will be able to enjoy a ride pulled by steam engine # 10 or diesel engine # 52. Go to their website to see what Sundays the steam engine runs.



The WW&F Railway is constantly improving the complex. Along with refurbishing Steam Engine # 9, the Museum is constantly upgrading the rail line, fixing culverts, and expanding the complex.

For those who may have been able to go to the Springfield show, you would have had the opportunity to see the Turner Center Dairy Car built in 2011/12.

New structures include a new bathroom building and a new 3 bay vehicle garage.

The museum is also trying to purchase more of the original right of way. Just recently they had purchased an  $828 \times 66$  strip of land.

If you have the opportunity to visit the WW&F, I believe you will have a great time looking at the various projects and riding the narrow gauge train.

# Photo Backdrops

Several companies produce commercial photo backdrops, and, or course you can produce your own. Some backdrops are from commercial photos and some are commercial artwork. I was able to pick up several backdrops from the white elephant table at a recent MER convention and the application is illustrated below. For my purposes, I needed an urban background to blend the 30 inch benchwork with commuter station tracks to add depth to the scene. Instant Horizons' 949-712 "Hotel-Business" was the

selected background. You will no doubt recognize this scene as a generic effort on many model layouts.

There are numerous ways to customize the stock photo. The structures are easily cut on the vertical to fit available space, or just to mix and match. You can also add details to structure photos such as loading docks, doors or windows to provide an additional dimension. What I have done initially is just cut out the sky. In doing so I removed some of the roof details just to simplify the cutting. On my extensive to do list is to change the signage on the stock commercial photos. (There was no Hotel Gotham in Boston in 1956 or at any other time.)

I have a large cutting glass bordered by duct tape with a blue shop towels underneath. This makes for a great work surface. I have used glass as a preferred cutting surface for quite a while, but the blue shop towels provide a great background to easily keep track of parts, etc. That is a tip that I picked up from Martin Brechbiel.

The folks at Instant Horizons recommend a spray adhesive applied to both surfaces. My backdrop is vinyl flooring painted on the back side. Ideally, you are applying the photo backdrop to a flat horizontal surface, but that is not always possible. Although I sprayed both surfaces I did find that a few building tops did not adhere well and required a second spritz. I used the bases of some old trophies to keep the backdrop in place while the glue dried.















I am pleased with the look. With new signs to better reflect Boston's North station neighborhood and foreground details including canopies over the six rows of station platforms this scene will work fine.

# **On the Road Again**


vents, interiors, roof contours and more are all as they should be per prototype plans and photos. It is always very inspirational, and challenging, to see expert modeling.
