### Holiday Trains for Kids By: R. Stephen Milley

During 2013, CPD13 had another successful year supporting the Holiday Trains for Kids **Program**. For those who are not familiar with the program, here's a quick overview: each year our local division of the NMRA seeks out lessfortunate families in the area who have children that would appreciate a model train set as a gift. These families may not typically be able to provide such a nice gift for their children during the holiday season, so this program really puts some smiles on the faces of local kids. CPD13 members seek out families through local churches, community centers, or out-reach programs, and we coordinate putting a train set into the hands of needy families. Each year, our group gives away 6-10 train sets.

For the 2013 holiday season, our group distributed 9 train sets - thanks to the efforts of the following CPD13 members: **Jack Dziadul**, **Jamie Jordan**, **Rob Rousseau**, **Grif Bond** and **John Janosko**. Train sets went to families in several areas around Raleigh – including Cary, Wake Forest, Sanford and Holly Springs.

To raise funds for this program, our group builds a small portable HO scale layout that we raffle off each November at the Neuse River Valley Train Show. All the materials for the raffle layout are either donated by CPD13 members or purchased via the small budget we allocate to this activity each year. Members donate their time and energy to build the layout during the year.

The 2013 raffle layout was one of the best fundraising efforts yet – bringing in just over \$1,100. This past year's winner was a young man in Warsaw, NC. All of those CPD13 members that contributed to the raffle layout – through the many possible ways to contribute – deserve a huge "thanks" for their efforts. The group can look forward to another raffle layout build during 2014, as there are plenty of layout supplies in our inventory, and hopefully eager contributors.

The following letter was received from the First Baptist Church of Sanford, NC.

I would like to thank you for arranging for two of our Family Promise families to receive a trainset for Christmas. Family Promise of Lee County is an organization that helps homeless families get back into housing. It is a program where the children continue to go through their daily schedules of school activities while their parents are helped with job searches, budgeting, savings accounts, and further education in order to help them get back into an affordable home. The families sleep in churches during their stay in the program. To date, we have helped 126 people return to their own places to live.

One of the families that received a train 'set is a mother with 4 children. Two are twin boys who are thirteen years old. They are thrilled with the train set and will be in a place where they will be able to set it up permanently, hopefully in another month or two. They were so appreciative to receive this present.

The other set went to a fourteen year old boy whose father was in the program with him last spring. Since that time, his father has been very ill and has spent several months in

the hospital at Duke. The father was so grateful to have something to give to his son for Christmas.

Thank you and your club for thinking of these children during the Christmas season. Your generosity made a difference in their Christmas during a hard time in their lives.

Sheds or barns, city or country roads, and buildings with signs were all enjoyable contest themes.

The popular vote contests were even more fun when more of the members participated. Remember! Everyone can bring two entries per month.

#### Programs and Clinics:

The programs were successful in that more individual presenters gave their time and

talents. We enjoyed the efforts of many "first time" presenters.

Our program year began with John Wallis' prototype quiz and the year concluded with our most popular program, the Yankee Swap Gift exchange. In between, we learned about Flat Car and Gondola Loads from the team of Grif Bond, Kim Parker, and John Janosko. We learned about trees from master forester Steve Milley.

We saw two buck cars from Vic Bitleris and Styrene Scratch Building by Luis Dominguez. Lou Sassi, our well-published author brought us down new roads. Mason Cutchin took us to the real Colorado & Southern gave us smart new ways to light up our models and lives.

## Proposed By-Law

Changes Jack Dziadul, Clerk

Jerry Mersch and Jack Dziadul reviewed the By-Laws to determine if any need revision. The following items were reviewed with the Board of Directors and the general membership in attendance at the November meeting.

1.2 Status. Paragraph 3, 1<sup>st</sup> sentence.

No part of the net earnings of the Division shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, board members or other private persons, except that the Division shall be authorized and empowered to pav compensation for reasonable services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth hereafter, including nominal cash or prize awards related to contest participation.

The above change is recommended to recognize that there may be nominal prizes awarded to membership for recognition of popular vote contest results, contest participation, Superintendent's Member of the Year award or other such nominal prizes as determined by the Board of Directors. This change is also in keeping with the spirit of Section 1.4 Purpose, which in part reads "4. To sponsor model railroad conventions, meets, clinics, and contests."

### Lou Sassi On The Road At Home By Jack Dziadul

Last Spring I had a chance to visit with Lou Sassi, tour his layout under construction and get to see some superb modeling. Lou was relatively new to the Raleigh area and had not seen many local layouts, so I volunteered to set up a day trip to meet some friends of mine in the hobby and see some quality layouts in various stages of completion. We made arrangements with seven CPD members for layout tours, and one Saturday in June Lou and his wife, Cheryl, and I visited each. The hosts were very gracious with their hospitality and we had a wonderful time. Lou did some initial photo shoots of many of the layouts that he thought might be candidates for a Model Railroader feature. Questionnaires were left with the layout owners for completion.

Two local layouts have been selected and Lou will be scheduling full photo and video shoots with **Jerry Davis'** O scale Southern Pacific and with **Jim Babcock's** HO scale Baltimore & Ohio. The lead time is such that we might not see these in the magazine until 2016. Jerry's layout will be featured in an upcoming Kalmbach's "Great Model Railroads" issue.

**Jim Murphy** could be seeing an article about his unique access door lift and his pull out classification yard. Jim models my favorite line, the Boston & Maine. Unfortunately for Jim though, the magazine folks seem to think that they have too many Northeastern roads and need to diversify. **Jerry Mersch** has a wonderful layout and it is COMPLETED; yes folks, some do actually complete a layout. But, the magazine gurus opined that Jerry's layout is too similar to others already in the queue. However, look for some photos of Jerry's layout in a future Walthers catalogue.


### Wilson Area Railroad Modelers By Russ Austin

Wilson Area Railroad Modelers or W.A.R.M. for short was founded in1980 by twenty charter members and incorporated in 1981 as a nonprofit organization. At first, our meetings were held in members' homes. We would view, work and sometimes operate their personal layouts. Early in 1981, the idea of having a club-built layout, utilizing the modular concept began. We believe it is the largest modular HO scale model railroad in the region. We have open houses every Saturday from 10am to 4pm. We will resume operating sessions every 3rd Saturday of the month beginning in January. The Operating Session includes a dispatcher using two-way radio communications and train orders for locals and through freight along with yard operations. W.A.R.M. uses DCC by Digitrax. **2013** Annual Superintendent's Report – Published in this issue is the annual Superintendents' report. The report is also provided to the Mid-Eastern Region.



### eBay GivingWorks Program

The NMRA participates in eBay's GivingWorks program, GivingWorks allows eBay users to donate a portion of winning auction prices to their favorite charity. Here is how it works. When you are selling any item on eBay, simply specify the 'National Model Railroad Association' as your chosen charity. Set a percentage of the final selling price to donate and let eBay do its work. If your item sells, the percentage you pre-select goes to the NMRA, and you keep the balance. An additional benefit to the seller is that eBay will reduce your final listing fees by the same percentage. If you donate 25% of the final auction price to the NMRA and your item was \$100, the NMRA receives \$25, you receive \$75 and your final listing fees from eBay are reduced by 25%.

Does it have to be train related items for sale? No, past winning auctions have included cell phones, iPhones, toner, calendars, manuals, and of course trains.

You can even donate directly from the NMRA GivingWorks page.
