### September Meeting Program to feature Author & Photographer Lou Sassi

The September clinic is *Fields to Fences & Woods to Walls* presented by Lou Sassi, Carolina Piedmont Division member and *Model Railroader* magazine author and photographer. Lou has been a model railroader since 1958. His former home layout, the HO Boston & Maine West Hoosic Division, was featured in the July 1988 *Model Railroader* and the 1996 and 1999 issues of *Great Model Railroads*, and other publications.

Following his and his wife Cheryl's move to North Carolina in 2009, Lou has made the switch to a new scale, On30, and began working in a new approach to scenery building using lightweight extruded foam. Lou's scenery techniques have been chronicled in his latest book, *Basic Scenery for Model Railroaders – Second Edition*, published earlier this year by Kalmbach Books.



### **Cardstock Clinic**

August program presented by Grif Bond

At the August meeting, CPD-13 Superintendent Grif Bond



presented a fun and informative hands on clinic on building structures from cardstock. The key to the technique is using computer printouts from Clever Models LLC. At left is a finished example of what can be created.

Using either 65 lb. cover stock for most applications, or 110 lb. stock for floors, roofs and bracing, Grif showed how to construct a variety of buildings in scales from **N** to **O** gauge. Modelers carefully cut out the printouts and learned tricks and techniques for folding and gluing the pieces into realistic structures that would be at home on any layout. ## December 13<sup>th</sup> - Setting up a train set from the box

Giving a train set for the holidays and not sure how to set it up? We will have an HO and O scale train set in the original box. You don't have to bring a train set to this clinic. The objective of this clinic is to be able to take the items out of the box, set it up on the floor or table, hook up the power supply and operate the train set. We will show you how to wire the track and transformer and any accessories you may have. There will be a question and answer session following the assembly. Class cost is \$5.00
