The Georgia Southwestern Division began operation on June 5, 1989 and is dedicated to accommodating your freight transportation needs both locally and beyond with safe, efficient, freight handling through a complete freight service program.

GSWR operates 288 miles of rail in South Georgia.
The company offers car leasing and flexible
switching services, as well as established run-through
service connections. These connections are closely
monitored by our positive and cooperative personnel.

Georgia Southwestern Rail Division is able to provide a stable market for satellite industries because of several on-line major industries. Our on-line customers vary from pulpwood to grain, and GSWR has the distinction of having direct access to two paper plants. GSWR has access to Mead Paper in Mahrt, AL, and Great Southern Paper in Cedar Springs, GA. International Paper is scheduled to begin operation in the fall of 1990 in Cordele, GA and that will be just one more major on-line industry that GSWR will have the privilege to serve.

Another unique feature of the Georgia Southwestern Division is its connections with two and soon to
be four feeder lines. The Georgia Alabama Division is
a sister feeder line that junctions with the GSWR at
Cuthbert, Georgia. The two additional feeder lines
are scheduled to begin operation in the summer of
1990. One will be the Atlantic and Gulf, junctioning
with the GSWR at Albany, Georgia. The other, the
Georgia Central, will connect at Rhine Georgia,
making possible access to the Savannah Ocean Port
facility; a feature not common among feeder lines.

Unique to the GSWR is its access to the Savannah ocean port as well as three river port at Bainbridge and Columbus, Georgia and at Eufaula, Alabama. This gives our customers waterway access to agricultural and industrial markets worldwide.
