ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION of THE NEW YORK AND NEW ORANGE RAILROAD COMPANY, a corporation formed under an act of the Legislature of the State of New Jersey entitled "An act "to authorize the formation of railroad corporations and regulate the same," approved April second, eighteen hundred and seventy-three, and the acts supplementary to and amendatory of the same.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that we, Charles W. Manahan Jr., of the Township of East Orange, in the County of Essex, and State of New Jersey; Dennis Long, of the Township of Union, in the County of Union, State of New Jersey; Theodore C. English and Nicholas C. J. English, of the City of Elizabeth, in the County of Union, State of New Jersey, Robert Grimes, of the City of Elmira, in the State of New York, George B. Frost, of the City of Newark, in the County of Essex, and State of New Jersey, and W. S. McCord, of the City of Elmira, in the State of New York, have formed ourselves into a company, under the said act of the Legislature and the acts supplementary to or amendatory of the same, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating a railroad, using steam or other motive power, for the public use in the conveyance of persons and property, and do make and sign these Articles of Association, as follows, to wit:



FIRST. The name of the said company shall be "THE NEW  
"YORK AND NEW ORANGE RAILROAD COMPANY."

SECOND. The said company shall continue in existence  
for the period of nine hundred and ninety-nine (999) years.

THIRD. The places from and to which the said railroad  
is to be constructed, maintained, and operated, are its be-  
ginning-point at the northerly side of the right of way line  
of the Central Railroad Company of New Jersey at the Village of  
Aldene, in the Township of Union, in the County of Union, and  
State of New Jersey, and its terminating point, at or near  
what is known as the R. S. Williams farm, in the Township of  
Union, in the County of Union, in the State of New Jersey.

FOURTH. The length of the said railroad, as nearly as  
may be, is two and one-eighth (2 1-8) miles, and the name of  
the County through which it is intended to be made is the Coun-  
ty of Union aforesaid.

FIFTH. The amount of the capital stock of the said com-  
pany shall be one hundred thousand (\$100,000.00) dollars, and  
the number of shares of which said capital shall consist shall  
be one thousand (1000) shares, of the par value of one hundred  
(\$100) dollars each.
